

ORDINANCE NO. 95

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF RULES, REGULATIONS AND CHARGES FOR THE COLLECTION OF REFUSE AND RECYCLABLES IN THE CITY OF UNIVERSITY HEIGHTS, IOWA.

WHEREAS, the City of University Heights desires to establish a recyclable program as part of the collection of refuse in the City,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF UNIVERSITY HEIGHTS, IOWA:

1. DEFINITIONS: Unless otherwise defined herein, the definitions appearing in Section 1 of Ordinance No. 93 shall apply to the provisions of this Ordinance:
 - (1) RECYCLABLES shall include the following:
 - (a) Paper -newsprint only- no magazines or colored print on shiny paper.
 - (b) Metal cans -tin or aluminum cans- to be rinsed and labels removed.
 - (c) Glass containers -brown, clear and green glass only.
 - (d) Plastic containers -recycling logo on bottom of container must have a 1 or a 2 in the middle of the logo. Container should be rinsed, the caps removed and the container flattened.
2. RULES AND REGULATIONS. The City Council shall by Resolution establish rules and regulations for the collection of refuse and recyclables.
3. CHARGE FOR COLLECTION. The City Council shall by Resolution establish charges to be made to residents for the cost of the collection of refuse and yard waste.
4. SEVERABILITY: If any of the provisions of this Ordinance are for any reason declared illegal or void, then the lawful provisions of this Ordinance, which are severable from said unlawful provisions, shall be and remain in full force and effect, the same as if the Ordinance contained no illegal or void provisions.
5. REPEALER: All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.
6. EFFECTIVE DATE: This Ordinance shall be in full force and

effect from and after its final passage and publication as by law provided.

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its final passage and publication as by law required.
